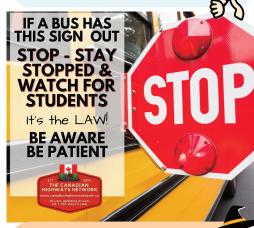

MOVIE REVIEW - THE ROSES (2025)

Directed by Jay Roach, written by Tony McNamara, and starring Olivia Colman as Ivy and Benedict Cumberbatch as Theo, the film follows a couple whose seemingly perfect marriage begins to crack under the pressure of ambition, shifting roles, and resentment. What begins with love and shared dreams

gradually turns into rivalry and bitterness all wrapped in sharp wit and theatrical flourishes. Colman and Cumberbatch are magnetic together.

The Roses is a strong film, especially because of the central performances and the clever updating of the source material. It's smart enough to make the audience feel for both characters while still indulging in the messiness of ambition and marriage. That said, it's not flawless. The film isn't quite as raw or biting as it has the potential to be; at times it plays it safe, relying on the glitz and the wit more than the gut.

Creepy Crawly Creamy Pasta Bake

Perfect for Halloween night — easy, hearty, and fun! Ingredients

1 lb ground beef (or ground turkey)

1 jar (650 ml) marinara or pasta sauce

1 can (284 ml) cream of mushroom soup

1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

1 box (450 g) rotini or "squiggly" pasta (spaghetti works too!)

1 tbsp olive oil

1 tsp garlic powder

Salt & pepper to taste

Black olives, cherry tomatoes, and mozzarella balls for "eyeballs" • •

Preheat oven to 375°F (190°C). Cook pasta until just tender. Drain and set aside. In a large skillet, cook the ground beef in olive oil until browned. Drain off any fat.

Add pasta sauce, mushroom soup, garlic powder, salt & pepper. Mix well and simmer for 5 minutes.

Combine pasta and sauce mixture in a greased baking dish. Top with shredded mozzarella and Parmesan cheese. Bake uncovered for 20–25 minutes until bubbly and golden.

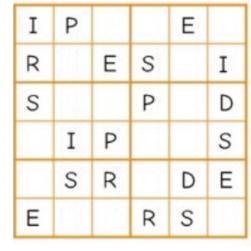
Decorate with 'eyeballs' by slicing mozzarella balls in half, topping each with an olive slice and a dot of ketchup or sriracha.
