## Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II 1926 – 2022



- she was crowned Queen on June 2, 1953.
- longest reigning monarch (ever) in Britain.
- only person in the UK allowed to drive without a licence.
- published her first Instagram post in 2019.
- in her lifetime, she sent around 50,000 Christmas cards.
- she owned an elephant, a jaguar and a pair of sloths.
- she became a homeowner at just six years old.
- her hobbies; horse riding, pigeon racing and football.
- she gave 180+ garden parties at Buckingham Palace, attended by more than 1.5 million people.



• she accepted Phillip's proposal without contacting her parents. When George VI learned of the pending nuptials, he would only officially approve if they waited to announce the engagement until after her 21st birthday. The official public announcement of the engagement finally came nearly a year later on July 9, 1947.



"I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong." ~1947 at age 21 years old.

On a low-key trip to Scotland, Queen Elizabeth II met some American tourists while walking. When the tourists asked if she lived locally, she mentioned that she had a house nearby, and when asked if she'd ever met the Queen she simply pointed at her security guard and said, "No, but he has!"

The fund's role is to support projects focused on:


- Protecting the environment by the responsible use of resources

## RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF GRAHAMDALE PUBLIC NOTICE BOARD OF REVISION FOR 2023



Public notice is hereby given that the 2023 Assessment Roll for the Rural Municipality of Grahamdale has been delivered to the Municipal Office and is open for public inspection during regular business hours.

Applications for revision may be made in accordance with Sections 42 & 43 of the Municipal Assessment Act:

**APPLICATION FOR REVISION:** 42(1) A person in whose name property has been assessed, a mortgagee in possession of property under subsection 114(1) of The Real Property Act, an occupier of premises who is required under the terms of a lease to pay the taxes on the property, the authorized agent of the person, mortgagee or occupier, or the assessor may make application for the revision of an assessment roll with respect to the following matters:

- (a) liability to taxation;
- (b) amount of an assessed value;
- (c) classification of property;
- (d) a refusal by an assessor to amend the assessment roll under subsection 13(2).

**APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:** 43(1) An application for revision must

- (a) be made in writing;
- (b) set out the roll number and legal description of the assessable property for which a revision is sought;
- (c) set out which of the matters referred to in subsection 42(1) are at issue, and the grounds for each of those matters; and (d) be filed by
  - (i) delivering it or causing it to be delivered to the office indicated in the public notice given under subsection 41(2), or (ii) serving it upon the Secretary, at least 15 days before the scheduled sitting date of the board as indicated in the public notice.

The Board of Revision will sit on Thursday, November 10th, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. at the Rural Municipality of Grahamdale Municipal Office to hear applications.

The final date on which applications must be received by the Secretary of the Board is Tuesday, October 25, 2022 at 4:30 p.m. The Applications must be sent to the address printed below:

## The Strength to Carry On

## Maple Grove Egg Buns

- 2 tsp traditional yeast
- 1 tsp sugar
- 3 eggs - well beaten
- 3/4 cup oil
- 1 tbsp baking powder
- 1/4 cup warm water
- 2 cups real warm water
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 3/4 tsp salt
- 6 1/2 cups flour (approximately)



Dissolve yeast in water and sugar. Let sit 10 minutes then add remaining ingredients. Add enough flour to make soft dough (don't make dough too stiff). Let rise in warm place until doubled - about 3/4 hour. Punch down and let rise again.

Make buns size of golf balls. Place on greased cookie sheet, cover, let rise. Bake at 370° for 25 minutes. Makes about 2 1/2 dozen.



## Maple Grove Cinnamon Buns

Make bun recipe as on previous. Instead of buns, roll dough in a rectangle about 8 x 12. Spread generously with melted butter. Sprinkle with brown sugar mixed with cinnamon and 1 tbsp flour. Roll up with your hands, work on the roll until it is about 25 - 30 inches in length. Cut into 2" pieces. Place in greased pans (use cake pans).



15 minutes later, turn each bun over and let rise for 1 hour. Bake at 350° for 1/2 hour. Take out of oven, tip upside down.

- Cinnamon Glaze:**
- 1 tbsp butter
  - 1.5 cups brown sugar
  - 1/2 cup cream
  - 1 tsp vanilla

Melt butter in small fry pan. Add brown sugar. Mix well, add cream and vanilla. Spread on cinnamon buns.
